




CKPIS Winter Semester: Vladimir Unkovski-Korica and Agustín Cosovschi

In January the last two guests presented their research in the series of seven online lectures titled *CKPIS Winter Semester*, which started in October 2020. Vladimir Unkovski-Korica, lecturer in Central and East European Studies, University of Glasgow, discussed the role of cities and municipal twinning agreements in Yugoslav foreign policy. Agustín Cosovschi, postdoctoral researcher and visiting lecturer, University Paris Nanterre, University of Paris and Catholic University of Lille, based the lecture on his latest research on Yugoslavia's endeavours to create stronger connections with Latin American governments and left-wing organisations in the early Cold War, especially in Chile. Youth and Work World in Postwar Europe (1945-1968) - online, 13-14 May 2021

The conference aspires to contextualize the experience of the francoist Universitary Service Work (Servicio Universitario del Trabajo) within the emergence process of youth organizations as well as other workers' initiatives in Europe. In addition, we seek to analyse its roots, its relationship with those other European ventures or with experiences like the post-war French worker priests. Finally, following the thread of the rupture of that restless youth with the social group, we will address their processes of politicization and radicalization. A phenomenon that reached its peak in the mobilizations that shook Europe at the end of the sixties, calling for the union between students and workers as protagonists of a new future that was opening up in the streets of Paris, Turin or Madrid. Those dreams turned sour soon. However, the mobilizations and desires for a more just and equitable social order provoked a far-reaching social and cultural transformation in European society without which we could hardly understand our present. Socialist Political Thought in East Central Europe, 1889-1968: Concepts, Debates, Questions – Budapest, 14-15 May 2021

The aim of this workshop is to develop histories of socialism as political thought in East Central Europe from the founding of the Second International in 1889 to the Soviet-led invasion of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic in 1968. To accomplish this goal, we particularly invite studies that reflect on the intellectual genealogies of socialist political thought in East Central Europe with a focus on the historicization of key concepts, debates, and questions. Put another way, we would like to solicit studies which address the conceptual components of socialist political thought in a given context and show how these elements were employed in certain polemics (and to which ends). PhD position in contemporary Southeast European history, Ghent University

Contemporary Southeast European societies are characterized by sharp sociospatial inequalities, not only at a transregional and global scale, but also within the region. While imperial legacies are important to understand these intraregional patterns, post-World War II development politics brought about specific processes of inner peripheralization and relative deprivation. We are seeking well-qualified applications for a doctoral research project on the intertwinement of social and spatial processes of peripheralization within Southeast Europe since the Second World War. Applicants are expected to independently develop the precise topic, methods and questions of their research within this framework, taking into consideration the following parameters. Research proposals should give priority to well-defined case- and regional studies of peripheral social spaces (from regions, urban environments or rural areas, to firms, neighbourhoods or villages). Comparative proposals analysing multiple inner peripheries across political boundaries are particularly welcomed. The successful candidate should also demonstrate awareness of the wider and global ramifications and disciplinary relevance of the research beyond Southeast European area studies. While a historical approach to the theme is essential, research projects applying multiple methods (such as geospatial techniques, bottom-up historical research, anthropological methods and field-work) will be given preference. The program is guided by the belief that there is a considerable added value for humanities scholars across the academe, whatever their field, to be encouraged to rethink their topics in terms of their broader contemporary relevance (be it political, ethical, religious or academic), yet necessarily of significance for the world we are living in.
