


CKPIS Winter Semester is over

The lecturers joined our virtual lecture hall from Udine, London, Rijeka, Berlin, Kelowna, Glasgow and Paris, while the audience came from different parts of Europe, North and South America. 13th ethnodoks workshop for PhDs 'What can ethnography really do?' - Vienna, 4-6 June 2021

Ethnography seems to have acquired a golden method status in the social sciences, promising indepth and holistic understandings otherwise unattainable. But outside of its discipline of origin, the scientific status of ethnography is often questioned or appears removed from its initial aspirations. Contemporary ambivalence around ethnography raises the questions of what it can or cannot actually do. For which research questions is it meaningful? What does it mean for knowledge production? Which critical potential does it bear? What is ethnography in the first place: an encounter, a method, a form of writing or knowledge, an identity or a theory? (Read more)

Rethinking Socialist Space in the Twentieth Century - Oxford, 23-24 June 2021

The purpose of this workshop is to draw together the latest advances on 'socialist space' – broadly conceived – from different arms of historical research. With a particular emphasis on transnational and international approaches to the twentieth century history of socialist space, the workshop will reflect on how developments in the field over the past two decades have altered our understanding of how such spaces were constructed (both literally and discursively), how they could become sites of contested meanings, and how they were perceived outside the socialist world. In particular, the workshop will be concerned with how scholarly approaches associated with postcolonialism, global history, gender history, and the 'temporal' and 'sensory' turns have reconfigured our understandings of the twentieth century history of socialist space. Bojan Simić, *Jugoslavija i Argentina 1946–1955*. (Beograd: Institut za noviju istoriju Srbije, 2021)

Nakon svršetka Drugog svetskog rata počinje nova etapa u odnosima između dve države. U Jugoslaviji se konsolidovala nova vlast na čelu sa Komunističkom partijom Jugoslavije, dok je u Argentini stvaran novi režim koji je takođe svoj oslonac tražio u radništvu. Obe zemlje su pokušavale da nađu sopstveni pravac u posleratnom svetu koji je sve više davao obrise novog sukoba između dve sile pobednice SAD-a i SSSR-a. Na tom putu čekale su ih brojni problemi i dileme, teški lomovi i izazovi, kako u unutrašnjoj tako i u spoljnoj politici. Odluka da izaberemo hronološki okvir od 1946. do 1955. ima više opravdanja. Početna granica izabrana je kao godina kada su ponovo uspostavljeni odnosi između Jugoslavije i Argentine, ali i kao godina kada je Huan Peron prvi put izabran za predsednika republike. Pored toga što analiza obuhvata period od praktično jedne cele decenije, kao razlog za krajnju granicu istraživanja vidimo i godinu puča u Argentini, odlazak Perona i dolazak vojne hunte, što je dovelo do nestabilnosti u zemlji i do faktičke paralize odnosa između dve države. To je i vreme kada se, posle perioda lutanja između dva bloka, bitno menjala jugoslovenska spoljna politika i kada se preorijentisala na politiku nesvrstanosti. (Read More)

Funding Support for three Postdoc Projects (2021), IOS Regensburg

For the further development of its research agenda, the Institute will provide funding for up to three postdoc starting grants (f/m/d) for 4 to 6 months. The grant (in form of an employment contract with IOS according to the TV-L pay agreement) serves to support the successful candidate to design and write a project application for third party funding for her/his own postdoc project. The duration of the grant is dependent on the intended funding programme. The proposed project shall contribute to the research priorities of IOS. The research topic must also relate to East and Southeast Europe. We invite applications from researchers with projects in the fields of history, economics and political science, or cognate disciplines. Multidisciplinary approaches are especially welcome. Interdisciplinary Joint MA Programme in Southeastern European Studies, The University of Graz and the University of Belgrade

The University of Graz and the University of Belgrade – Faculty of Political Sciences (FPS) are pleased to announce the call for applications for the academic year 2020/2021 for the Interdisciplinary Joint Master's Programme in Southeastern European Studies. This two-year MA program is conducted in English as a Joint Programme with an obligatory study abroad period. The 11th generation of students will start in September 2021. At the University of Graz the two former programmes – International Joint Master's Programme in Southeastern European Studies and the Joint Degree "History in South-Eastern Europe" – are combined, offering two focus areas (Law and Politics / History) as of this this study year. Students enroll in and spend the first year at the chosen entrance university (Graz or Belgrade). In the second year, students spend at least one semester on mobility at a partner university. Scholarships for German language courses in Bavaria 2021, BAYHOST

The scholarships for courses in Bavaria include tuition fees, accommodation and meals; in case of online course the course fee will be covered. Students and young academics of all disciplines with intermediate German proficiency (at least B1-level) from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Russia, Serbia, Slovenia and Ukraine can apply for BAYHOST summer course scholarships. At the time of application students need to have completed at least two entire semesters at an institute of higher education and provide corresponding grades. (read more)
